

# National Day of Remembrance for Road Crash Victims

# Theme: "We do not want more victims to remember, we want to live our lives together"

### I. Rationale

In a world full of chaos and uncertainty, it is important to look at the brighter side of things. Everything is unpredictable so being aware that every situation has a brighter side is truly an advantage. It will depend on our attitude and how we look at a situation. But despite the negativities, what matters most is being knowledgeable and responsible in everything we do.

Every third Sunday of November each year, the World Day of Remembrance for Road Crash Victims is commemorated to remember the many millions killed and injured in road crashes, their families and communities, as well as to pay tribute to the dedicated emergency crews, police and medical professionals who daily deal with the traumatic aftermath of road death and injury.

This day has become an important tool in global efforts to reduce road casualties. It provides an opportunity to draw attention to the scale of emotional and economic devastation caused by road crashes and to recognize the suffering of road crash victims and the work of support and rescue services.

With this commemoration, the Decade of Action for Road Safety 2011-2020 has been officially proclaimed by the UN General Assembly in March 2010 to save millions of lives by building road safety management capacity; improving the safety of road infrastructure; further developing the safety of vehicles; enhancing the behavior of road users; and improving post-crash response.

In light of this, the Department of Education (DepEd), through the Bureau of Learner Support Services – Youth Formation Division (BLSS-YFD), in partnership with DepEd Region VII will conduct a virtual activity to commemorate the road crash victims.

### II. Objectives

This activity aims to:

- 1. provide a platform for road crash victims and their families to commemorate the all people killed and seriously injured on the roads;
- 2. acknowledge the crucial work of dedicated emergency crews, police and medical professionals;
- 3. draw attention to the greater public of the importance of road safety for road crash injury prevention; and
- 4. advocate for better support for road crash victims and victim families.

School Level	After the virtual event, all personnel reporting in schools shall conduct a candle-lighting ceremony and shall be participated and observed by learners via a virtual platform.
