

Bohol Commemorates UN World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims with Memorial Mass and Candlelight Vigil

Tagbilaran City, Bohol, Philippines – November 10, 2024 – In observance of the United Nations' World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims on November 17, 2024, The Roman Catholic Dioceses of Tagbilaran, in collaboration with Tagbilaran Vehicle Inspection Center (TaVIC), Tubigon Vehicle Inspection Center (TuVIC), SmartSafe Driving School, and road safety advocates, will host a *Solemn Memorial Mass* to honor those who have lost their lives in road traffic incidents and to promote road safety awareness within the community.

Memorial Mass Details:

- **Date:** Sunday, November 17, 2024
- **Time:** 9:00 AM
- **Venue:** Tagbilaran Cathedral (Parish of St. Joseph the Worker)
- **Officiant:** Most Reverend Bishop Alberto S. Uy

Leading up to the memorial Mass, families who have lost loved ones to road traffic accidents are invited to submit the names of the deceased to their respective local parishes or through commenting their names on the event's post the Diocese's Facebook Page. These names will be included in the prayers during the Mass, ensuring a personalized and heartfelt commemoration.

Submission Process:

- **Deadline:** Friday, November 15, 2024
- **How to Submit:** Write the names of your dearly departed loved ones on the material provided in your local parish or comment on the campaign's facebook post that will be posted on the Diocese Facebook Page.

In alignment with the global campaign's theme, "That Day," the Diocese encourages the community to reflect on the profound impact of road traffic incidents and to advocate for safer roads. The campaign emphasizes the importance of remembering the specific day when a traffic collision altered lives forever, highlighting the need for collective action to prevent such tragedies.

Additional Activities:

- **Road Safety Workshops:** Educational sessions will be conducted in schools and community centers across Bohol to promote safe driving practices, roadworthiness of vehicles, and pedestrian awareness. (after November 17)
- **Candlelight Vigil:** On the evening of November 24, a candlelight vigil will be held at the Tagbilaran City Plaza, providing a space for reflection and solidarity.

The World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims, observed annually on the third Sunday of November, serves as a global platform to honor the memory of those killed and injured on the roads, acknowledge the crucial work of emergency services, and advocate for better support for road traffic victims and their families.

About the World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims:

Initiated in 1993 by the UK-based charity RoadPeace, the World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims was endorsed by the United Nations General Assembly in 2005. It is observed globally to remember those killed and injured on the roads, acknowledge the suffering of all affected victims, families, and communities, and to advocate for evidence-based actions to prevent further road traffic deaths and injuries.
